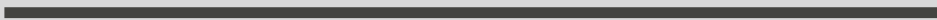

## Carla Itzkowich

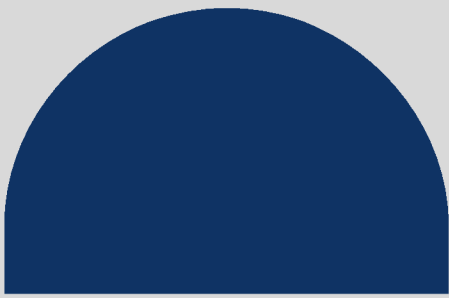

## SHARED EDUCATION

### THE ABRAHAM INITIATIVES



Abraham Initiatives is dedicated to ensuring that the State of Israel upholds its commitment to granting full and equal citizenship, as well as complete social and political rights, to both Jewish and Arab citizens. This commitment is enshrined in Israel's declaration of independence, which emphasizes the country as the national homeland for the Jewish people while also providing a full, complete, and equal home for the Arab minority.

In 2021, the Itzkowich family played a significant role in supporting the Shared Learning project. This initiative aims to create unique opportunities within Israel's distinct education systems in order to foster connections between Jewish and Arab schools. The project brings together middle school classes from neighboring communities, with Arab and Jewish students learning English together. The classes are co-taught by both Arab and Jewish teachers, and regular meetings are arranged between the two schools. This year, a total of 738 students from 7 different schools participated in the program.

## GIVAT HAVIVA INTERNATIONAL SCHOOL

GHIS is an English-speaking boarding high school located in Israel. The school's mission is to bring about positive change in the Middle East and beyond by nurturing young individuals into global leaders who are dedicated to creating a more just and peaceful future. In 2021, the Itzkowich family contributed to the 10th Grade Expansion program, which aimed to enhance the educational and social experience of Jewish and Arab Israeli students at GHIS. By adding an additional grade level, the school provided these students with better preparation to excel academically and socially. This expansion enabled an additional 27 students to enroll at the high school.





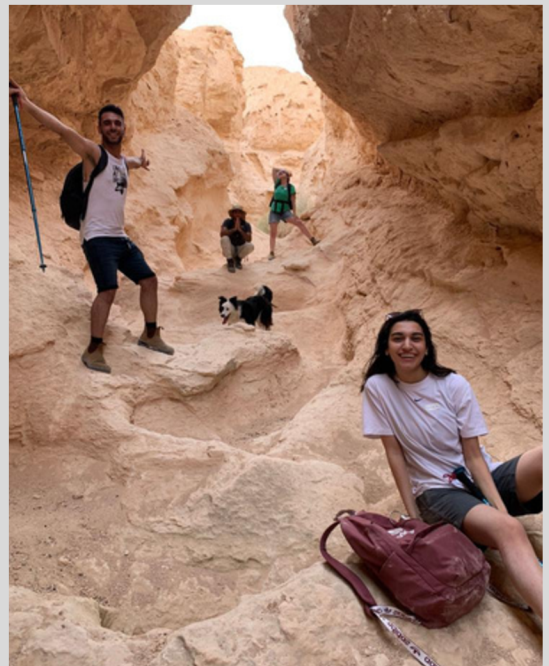
### MIDDLE EAST CHILDREN'S ALLIANCE

The Middle East Children's Alliance (MECA) is an organization dedicated to safeguarding the rights and enhancing the well-being of children in the Middle East who are affected by war and occupation. Our generous donors have played a vital role in supporting the establishment of a playground in Kafr Aqab village. This village is home to approximately 13,000 children who have limited access to safe and suitable places to play. The existing play areas in the village are either dilapidated, cramped, or hazardous. Thanks to the contributions of our donors, MECA has been able to fund the construction of a new playground, providing these children with a safe and enjoyable space.

### MABAT - AWARENESS IN MULTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Mabat's mission is to bring about social change in Israeli society by promoting intercultural awareness, equipping individuals with the necessary tools for navigating a multicultural environment, and fostering the development of intercultural discourse communities. Mabat achieves this by implementing transformative programs on Israeli college campuses, aimed at cultivating multicultural awareness, combating prejudice and racism, and advocating for diversity and coexistence. By providing students with the skills to thrive in a multicultural setting, Mabat empowers them to become catalysts for change within their own communities.

In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support for the Communal Initiatives Program, which encompassed five major community projects involving over 500 active participants. Through the community leadership program, Mabat actively builds its intercultural community, fostering strong relationships among its diverse members and setting an example for a more inclusive future for everyone.



## SHARED EDUCATION

### PARENTS CIRCLE - FAMILIES FORUM



The Parents Circle – Families Forum (PCFF) is an organization comprised of more than 600 Israeli and Palestinian families who have tragically lost immediate family members in the ongoing conflict. In 2021, the Itzkowich family played a supportive role in two programs: Dialogue Leaders and Strength in Numbers.

The Dialogue Meetings program is built on the belief that education and open conversations can bring about positive changes in societal values, perspectives, and relationships. It aims to help individuals overcome the pain associated with any conflict and navigate the frustrations encountered along the path to peace. These meetings feature a team of Israeli and Palestinian co-facilitators, both of whom have experienced personal loss and subsequent transformation. Through sharing their own stories, they encourage participants to confront their own suspicions, fears, and hatreds.

The second program, Strength in Numbers, is a community initiative designed for bereaved Israeli and Palestinian members of the PCFF. Its objective is to enhance their capabilities, strengthen their commitment, and deepen their involvement in promoting reconciliation and its broader impact. This includes engagement in cross-border activities between Israelis and Palestinians, as well as within their respective communities.

During this year, the PCFF organized more than 184 Dialogue Meetings, with the participation of over 1230 individuals across both programs. .

## KEREN HAYESOD - UNITED ISRAEL APPEAL

Since its establishment, Karen Haysod has been at the forefront of Israel's growth and development and it enables all of those who want to support Israel as the Jewish homeland, enhance the lives of the people of Israel, and strengthen the connection between them and Jewish communities around the world. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support for two programs: Youth Futures in Mixed Jewish-Arab Cities and Net@ in the city of Ramla.

Youth Futures in Lod and Akko is a mentoring program that assists at-risk children and their families. It operates in coordination with schools and communities, helping participants overcome challenges and achieve personal and academic goals. This program works with over 4,000 children each year, spanning 31 locations across the country, including communities with a mix of Jewish and Arab residents. Net@ focuses on creating social mobility for underserved youth in Ramla, a diverse city in the periphery. It instills technological excellence and leadership skills in students from 5th to 12th grade, bringing together Jewish, Muslim, and Christian youth. During the 2021-2022 school year, Net@ Ramla reached 120 students.





---

### UNRWA USA

UNRWA USA aims to advocate for American support in providing essential resources to Palestine refugees, ensuring a better life by amplifying their voices, experiences, and humanity. One pressing issue in Gaza is the lack of access to clean water and proper sanitation. In response, UNRWA has taken the initiative to establish small-scale desalination plants at its schools, purifying water from the municipal supply and meeting the drinking water needs of the students. To address power supply challenges and promote environmentally friendly solutions, UNRWA has implemented solar-powered desalination plants. In 2021, the Itzkowich family contributed to the Provision of Safe Drinking Water in UNRWA Schools program. As a result, UNRWA successfully installed plants at 3 schools, benefiting 6,198 students with access to clean drinking water.

## YEMIN ORDE YOUTH VILLAGE

The mission of Yemin Orde Youth Village is to help at-risk youth refocus their energies from daily struggle and survival towards achieving success in their present lives and into the future. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support for the Expanded Therapeutic Care Program and the Transitions Program at the Village. The primary goal of the Therapeutic Care Program is to offer the most suitable therapeutic care to every youngster at Yemin Orde, addressing deep-rooted issues stemming from poverty, immigration, instability, abuse, and traumas they have experienced in the past. The Transitions Program aims to guide their older youth and recent graduates in making wise and informed choices about their futures, preparing them for life beyond graduation as they transition from living at the Village to becoming young adults. This year, a total of 422 students were able to participate in both programs with the generous support of the Itzkowich family.

# PHILOSOPHY

UNITED STATES



Our work in the America reflects the diverse interest of our donors. These interests are broken up into categories as displayed within the following sections.

## OBJECTIVE

Our goal is to provide access and opportunities to marginalized populations across various spheres of life.



## DEMOCRACY AND VOTING

### CIVIC NATION

Civic Nation is an advanced technology platform that connects highly skilled volunteer lawyers with nonprofits and causes in need of their expertise. In 2021, the Itzkowich family supported the creation of law firm accounts on the We The Action Platform. The platform, found at [www.wetheaction.org](http://www.wetheaction.org), allows individual lawyers to sign up for projects independently. While many of our lawyers work at law firms, they sign up for projects on an individual basis and handle any issues with their firms themselves (such as resolving conflicts or determining eligibility for pro bono credit). Additionally, law firms also approach them directly for projects they wish to take on through their platform. Their goal is to collaborate with their technology team and develop new tools that enable law firms to create firm-level accounts on We The Action's web platform.



---

### INDEPENDENT MEDIA INSTITUTE

IMI is a nonprofit organization dedicated to educating the public through various independent media projects and programs. They collaborate with journalists and media outlets to bring attention to stories that are crucial for the public's interest, employing different media formats and distribution channels. In 2021, the Itzkowich family played a supporting role in the Voting Booth initiative, which successfully published and distributed 875 articles. These articles reached a broad audience through a mass email list of 450,000 subscribers, as well as a targeted list of 12,000 individuals including party insiders, voting experts, and media outlets.



### COMMON CAUSE EDUCATION FUND

In support of Common Cause's mission of promoting open, honest, and accountable government, the Common Cause Education Fund seeks, through research, public education and innovative programs, to: increase public understanding of the democratic process and, where appropriate, the need for change; empower citizens and promote their effective participation in all aspects of the democratic process at the local, state and federal level; and empower citizens to hold their government accountable. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support the 2022 Election Protection Program which provided critical materials and supplies to deploy 500-700 trained volunteer poll monitors during the 2022 elections during primaries, early voting, and on Election Day.



### PEOPLE FOR THE AMERICAN WAY FOUNDATION

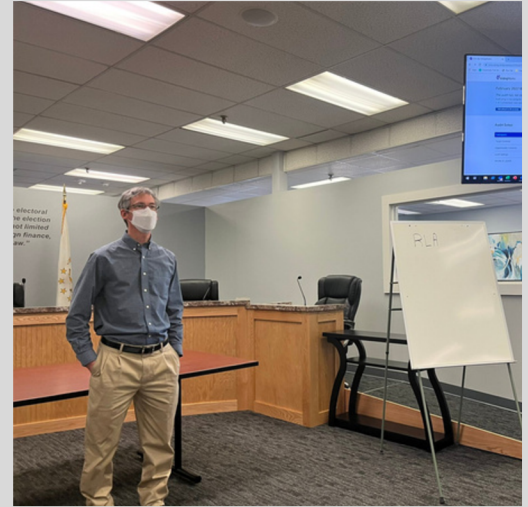
People For the American Way is an organization dedicated to creating a democratic society that upholds the principles of freedom, equality, opportunity, and justice for everyone. They promote active involvement in civic affairs, protect essential rights, and strive to remove structural obstacles that hinder fair opportunities. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided assistance to the Young Elected Officials Network, a renowned program that trains and supports young individuals who aspire to champion social justice in their communities. This year, the program reached an all-time high participation with 1230 young leaders involved.



### VERIFIED VOTING

The mission of the Verified Voting Foundation is to strengthen democracy by promoting the responsible use of technology in elections. Since 2004, Verified Voting has collected data on the nations voting technology and made this information freely available through an interactive online tool known as the Verifier, which has become the most comprehensive set of data related to voting equipment usage in the United States. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support to the Evidence-Based Elections project. This project aims to ensure that the necessary elements for a reliable voting record, which are crucial for verifying elections, are in place in specific states.

The assurance provided by this project is based on research and data. By identifying the vulnerabilities in voting systems, the nonprofit can focus their efforts and resources effectively to make significant progress. This knowledge also enhances their recommendations and efforts to convince both officials and the public about the importance of this work.



## FREE INFORMATION & MEDIA

### NATIONAL PUBLIC RADIO.



NPR's mission is to create a more informed public. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support the NPR Newsroom. Philanthropic support for the NPR Newsroom provides funding to a wide swath of news programs and shows that NPR produces. This year, with the help of the Itzkowich family, the project helped reach a record 48 million listeners.

### SAN DIEGO SOCIAL VENTURE PARTNERS



San Diego Social Venture Partners unleashes the potential of professionals across sectors to increase nonprofits' organizational strength and resulting impact. SDSVP provides pro bono consulting and grants to high potential organizations aiming to tackle San Diego's most pressing challenges. In 2021, the Itzkowich family partnered with SDSVP which helped them to achieve 80 nonprofits partners through targeted engagements.

### OXFAM

OXFAM America is dedicated to combating inequality, poverty, and injustice. In 2021, the Itzkowich family played an important role in supporting the Tigray Conflict Ethiopia Humanitarian Response Project, which aimed to address the urgent needs arising from the crisis in Tigray. Their assistance enabled Oxfam to provide vital assistance such as basic healthcare, protection, and food supplies. With the help of the Itzkowich family, Oxfam successfully ensured that 30,000 people had access to clean and safe drinking water. Additionally, Oxfam facilitated access to dignified sanitation facilities and hygiene services for 7,500 individuals in the affected communities.



---

### AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL

AIUSA is dedicated to safeguarding and advancing human rights globally. They achieve this goal through two approaches: long-term programs that focus on persistent human rights issues, and shorter-term campaigns that address urgent human rights crises as they arise.

In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support to the Refugee and Migrant Rights program. This initiative utilized research, advocacy, and grassroots activism to drive social and political change. AIUSA's activities included conducting research and releasing press statements as part of their report on the mistreatment faced by migrants and asylum-seekers from countries like Haiti, Mexico, Honduras, El Salvador, and others. These individuals continue to experience routine abuse as they flee humanitarian crises. This distressing pattern underscores the need for ongoing efforts to ensure their fundamental human rights are acknowledged and upheld.



### DREAMS FOR CHANGE

Dreams for Change is an organization dedicated to addressing the needs of the community through the development of creative and affordable initiatives that empower and stabilize the lives of disadvantaged families and individuals. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided support to the Dreams Cuisine program. This program, operated as a social enterprise utilizing food trucks, focuses on equipping individuals with the necessary skills and eliminating obstacles to succeed in a conventional job setting. Throughout the year, the Dreams Cuisine program served a total of 72 individuals, providing them with valuable job readiness training.



### KITCHENS FOR GOOD

Kitchens for Good (KFG) is a nonprofit with a mission to use food to transform lives and nourish communities by providing people with the skills and support to launch meaningful careers. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support Project Nourish which helps to close that meal gap for home-bound seniors living on a fixed income; families that live at or near the federal poverty level; military families; and low-income college students. With the support of the Itzkowich family, the project prepared and delivered 118,000 meals and engaged 144 apprentices in the production of hunger relief meals as they work towards launching a career.



### RISE UP INDUSTRIES

Rise Up Industries aims to reduce gang involvement by offering a comprehensive range of services, including gang prevention, gang intervention, and post-detention reentry support. In 2021, the Itzkowich family played a significant role in supporting Rise Up Industries' Reentry Program. This program provides services to individuals who were previously involved in gangs and have recently been released from incarceration. This year, the program successfully assisted 21 men in completing the program, achieving a remarkable 100% job success rate. A key component of the Reentry Program is their Machine Shop Social Enterprise, where members are trained for careers as CNC (Computer Numeric Control) machine operators. This is a well-paid trade that is in high demand. It also fills a critical skills gap in San Diego's machining industry where demand for skilled CNC machine operators far outweighs supply.



### EDUCATION & SPORTS

#### OUTDOOR OUTREACH

Outdoor Outreach's goal is to link young people with the life-changing potential of the outdoors, where they can develop resilience in the face of difficulties and gain confidence in their ability to create positive change. In 2021, the Itzkowich family contributed to the support of Outdoor Outreach Adventure Clubs. Thanks to their assistance, 400 young individuals were able to participate in enriching programs centered around adventure, which encouraged physical activity and emotional well-being. These programs also fostered peer relationships and provided valuable connections with positive mentors.



### PRO KIDS

Pro Kids, First Tee - San Diego aims to empower disadvantaged youth by fostering character development, teaching life skills, and instilling values through education and the game of golf. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided important support to the Pro Kids Academy Program. This program is specifically designed to assist children in reaching grade-level proficiency in reading and math, while also nurturing their interest in STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) through various workshops and extracurricular activities such as art club and cooking club. These opportunities are typically unavailable to the students. A total of 77 young individuals actively participated in the program in 2021.

### UC Berkeley Foundation

In 2021, the Itzkowich family contributed to the support of UC Berkeley Library's Work+Learn program. The mission of the UC Berkeley Library is to assist current and future users in discovering, assessing, utilizing, and generating knowledge to make the world a better place. The UC Berkeley Library serves as a bridge between students, scholars, and the vast realm of information and ideas. Among UC Berkeley's largest employers of students, the Library's Work+Learn program offers students valuable and engaging work opportunities on campus. These experiences encompass a wide range of tasks, from digitizing maps and cataloging foreign language materials to creating videos and podcasts. Thanks to the assistance of the Itzkowich family, a total of 408 students were able to participate in this program.



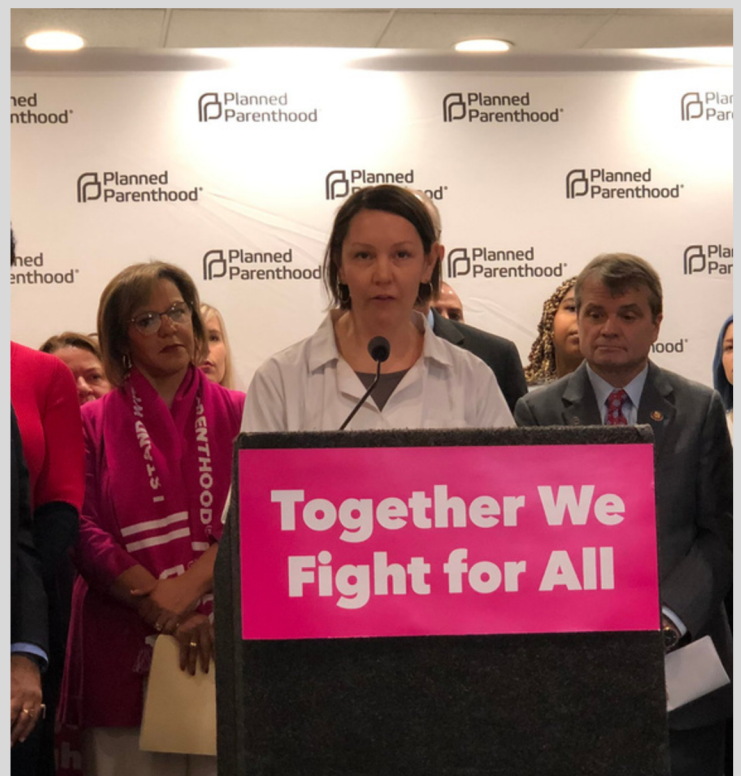
## UCSF Foundation

The UCSF Breast Care Center’s mission is to provide innovative, comprehensive breast care that addresses the needs of the whole person. To do this, they offer state of the art health care services, extensive psychological support, and clinical trial research. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support UCSF Breast Surgical Oncology Fellowship – Travel Fund which supports 3 fellows’ attendance, involvement, and travel to educational, medical, and scientific conferences across the United States and worldwide.



## PLANNED PARENTHOOD OF ILLINOIS

Planned Parenthood of Illinois (PPI) is the leader in providing and promoting compassionate, comprehensive reproductive health care, education, and rights. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support the RESOLVE Campaign. The purpose of the RESOLVE CAMPAIGN is to broaden and expand access to sexual and reproductive health care in the Midwest. With the help of donors like the Itzkowich family, PPI could provide care for 61,688 individuals in 2021.





## HEALTHNETWORK FOUNDATION

The Healthnetwork Foundation is a nonprofit organization dedicated to enhancing healthcare for everyone. They achieve this by connecting CEOs and business leaders with leading hospitals and doctors to ensure optimal access to world-class care. Additionally, they strive to increase philanthropic funding for medical research. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided financial support for the research of Healthnetwork Foundation's Medical Director, Dr. Richard Cartabuke, a board-certified internal medicine and executive health physician at Cleveland Clinic, serves as the Medical Director. His role involves being readily available to offer expert opinions and insights to the foundation's team whenever they require guidance on managing a particular case or navigating through hospital bureaucracy. In the current year, Dr. Cartabuke has provided consultations for more than 50 cases.

## CLIMATE & ENVIRONMENT

### DEFENDERS OF WILDLIFE

Defenders of Wildlife is a national nonprofit organization that aims to protect all native animals and plants in their natural habitats. Their goal is to ensure that wildlife populations in North America are thriving and secure, with the support of healthy wild lands and waterways. In 2021, the Itzkowich family provided assistance to the Ocelot Program, which focused on raising awareness about the presence of ocelots in South Texas and promoting effective coexistence strategies. Through educational initiatives, outreach efforts, and conservation activities, the program successfully reached 1,445 individuals through targeted webinars and in-person events.



---

### URBAN STREET ANGELS

Urban Street Angels mission is to end youth homelessness by providing supportive housing and job opportunities to cultivate personal responsibility. In 2021, the Itzkowich family helped support Mentorship Program where mentors assisted 7 youth with necessary life activities (trips to the DMV and Social Security, medical appointments, job interviews, etc.) while sharing knowledge as well as life skills.

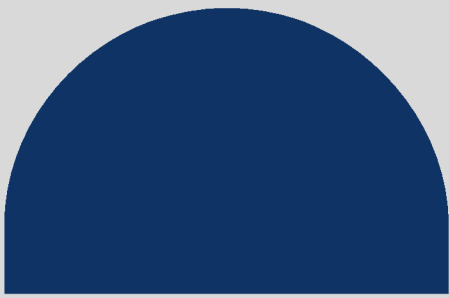

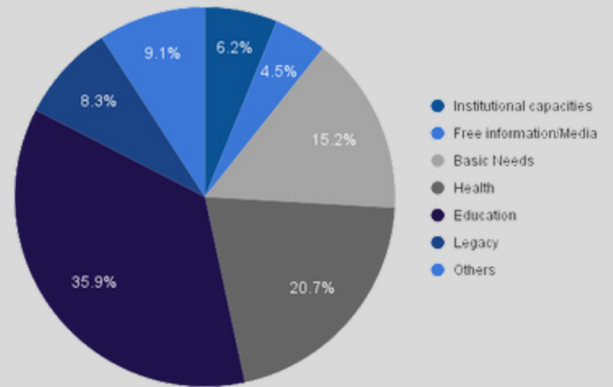

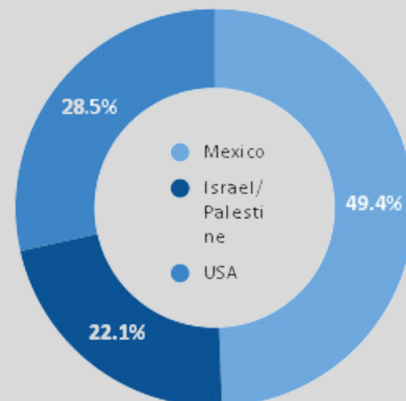
